In 2018, for the Lent season, Joel 2:12-14 will be used to reflect and meditate on, this is also the scripture to be used as a memory passage. In summary, this scripture is about renting our hearts as we intentionally return to God in life and service. If you are not able to do anything else please read through the Gospel Reading Plan. Specific activities that will take place during Lent are as follows:

- Daily 5:00am individual prayer
- Beginning Monday, February 19, 2018 a 5:00am corporate conference call prayer (call in number 712-775-7270; access code 601970)
- Daily scripture reading (reading plan attached)
- Daily pastoral devotional messages
- Corporate prayer fellowship on 2nd and 3rd Wednesday's at 7:00pm (Feb 21; March 14, March 21)

The congregation is called to a corporate fast; however, the structure of the fast is left to the dictates of the conscious of individuals as to what will be offered as a sacrifice (Psalm 116:12). Pastor will be eating one daily meal before sun down, and then just water until sunrise. If you choose to participate in a food fast, please check with your physician to get permission and to see what parameters may need to be considered. Others may choose to fast Monday through Saturday and have a break on Sunday; since each Sunday is the day we celebrate Jesus' resurrection.

40 days through the Gospels at Lent

"LENT" comes from the Old English word for Spring, and it is a period of 40 days before Easter, excluding Sundays. Lent is a time to reflect on what God has done for you and me. The LENTEN season reminds us that we are mortal, and that our future lies completely in the hands of the God who created us.

LENT begins on Ash Wednesday with the tradition (not a requirement) of putting ashes on the forehead in the form of a cross as a sign of our sinfulness (the ashes usually come from the dried and burned palms from Palm Sunday the year before). Isaiah, Jeremiah, Daniel, and Jonah are all Old Testament prophets who talk about wearing ashes as a sign of our sinfulness, and Jesus also mentions it as a fitting sign of repentance. The ashes are a sign of humility and recognition of your own sin.

In an effort to identify with special 40 day biblical periods in the Bible, many early Christians decided to "fast" -- that is, they give up one or more things in their lives as a sacrifice to God for the 40 days leading up to Easter.

This Lent reading plan walks through each of the four Gospels during the Lent season. What better way to prepare for Easter than to read the complete story of Jesus' birth, life, death and resurrection?

40 Days in the 4 Gospels

“REAPS” Bible Study

READ

Open your Bible and ask the Holy Spirit to teach, rebuke, correct, and train you (2 Timothy 3:16). As you’re reading, ask these questions:

- What is happening in this passage? What things are emphasized, repeated, related?
- What do you see about Jesus? What do you see about man?
- Who is the author and what is the context that surrounds this passage?



EXAMINE

Spend some time reflecting. Ask yourself these questions, and write down your thoughts:

- How do you think the author wants his audience to respond?
- What do you learn about God’s character?
- What wrong beliefs about God and/or about yourself did you have?

APPLY

After examining the passage, apply the text to your own life. Ask yourself these questions:

- What truths do I need to believe? How am I encouraged?
- How do I need to repent? What false beliefs must I turn from?
- What can I do – empowered by the Holy Spirit – today to apply this passage?

PRAY

Pray through the passage and your application, asking God to change your heart, mind, and life according to what He has revealed to you through His Word.

SHARE

After you finish, share what God taught you with at least one person—your roommate, your spouse, your kids, or your coworkers. Don’t keep what God taught you to yourself.
