1. Download & install the Cash app.
2. Open Cash app.
3. Enter your phone number or email address & tap next.
4. Type the confirmation code and tap "NEXT". You will be provided a 6-digit confirmation code.
5. Type a debit card number and tap "NEXT".



GIVELIFY
TMBCSeattle

1. Download the free Givelify app
2. Locate Tabernacle Missionary Baptist Church
3. Tap the Give button
4. Tap the amount
5. Select an envelope (where you want the gift to go towards)
6. Tap Give Now
7. Create your account
8. Securely enter your payment information
9. Complete your donation

Blacks at a Glance

First Black Georgia Senator

Pastor/Senator Elect Raphael Gamaliel Warnock



On January 5, 2021 Raphael Warnock made history by becoming the first African American elected by Georgia to the U.S. senate and only the eleventh black senator in U.S. history. He won, in part, thanks to the astronomical Black turnout. Raphael Warnock is the senior pastor at the historic Ebenezer Baptist Church, once led by Reverends Martin Luther King Sr. and Martin Luther King Jr, in Atlanta, Georgia. Warnock was born on July 23, 1969 in Savannah, Georgia and grew up in the Kayton Homes, a public housing project. He is the eleventh of twelve children of two Pentecostal pastors Jonathan and Verlene Warnock. Warnock graduated from Sol C. Johnson High School in Savannah in 1987. While in high school, he participated in the Upward Bound program and enrolled in early college courses through Savannah State University. After high school graduation, Warnock attended Morehouse College and earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in psychology in 1991. Warnock earned a Master of Divinity, Master of Philosophy (1994), and Doctor of Philosophy (2006), all from Union Theological Seminary. After receiving his M. Div., he was ordained in the ministry. Warnock responded to the call of ministry at an early age and has served in various ministry positions before becoming the senior pastor of Ebenezer Baptist Church, in 2005. Warnock is a member of 100 Black Men of Atlanta, Inc., the NAACP, and Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc. He will hold his Senate chair through January 3, 2023. Warnock and his ex-wife, Ouley Ndoye, have two children, Chloe and Caleb.
